Reading is one of the most important ways to promote learning during the summer. Reading can be done anywhere - anytime. Include favorite children's books or magazines to read together and invite your child to read environmental **print** that is around you every day. Environmental print can include the back of a cereal box, a menu, a grocery list, and a recipe

Consider joining the local library Reading Program "A Universe of Stories". The Enoch Pratt Library and Baltimore County library websites have suggested book lists for Pre-K.

Outdoor play is a critical component to addressing the needs of the whole child – the whole learner. Outdoor play offers many opportunities for exercise, play, and exploring the child's natural environment. You don't want to structure every moment of your child's summer but throwing in a <u>scavenger hunt</u> or a family walk in the park is a great way to build memories, get a little exercise, and promote learning.
