BASKETBALL UPDATE - WEEK 6

Another exciting weekend for Anchor BB adding two more wins and an overtime loss. The 8th grade boys continued their dominance on the hardwood beating a stubborn St. Joe Fullerton team 34 - 33 improving their record to 4 - 1. The dramatic ending to this game was truly magical. After numerous lead changes and with 12 seconds left, Coach Cos called time out, called a play. Anchors in-bounded in the backcourt. With the clock winding down, PG Quinn McCartney brought the ball to the top of the key. As we waited for Quinn's 3pointer, he dribbled right, off a Nick Purtell screen, passed to Gavin Sadler inside the arc and what seemed like behind the backboard, let it fly and as the horn sounded, the ball touched nothing but net. Anchor fans go CRAZY! Scoring: Quinn McCartney (11), Nick Purtell (10) including (2) 3's, Adean Joyce (7) including 7 for 9 from the free throw line (and a million rebounds), Hudson Dach (4), GAVIN SADLER (2). This was our Anchor program's first buzzer beater ever! <u>5th grade boys</u> easily handled Cathedral, 14-4 with strong rebounding, and offense, scoring by Jack McCartney (8), Jacson Graham (4) and Emerson Lawrence (2).Coach Lally's team is in a battle with Cardinal Shehan for 1st place in the division. 4th grade boys lost a tough one 12-10, in triple overtime. Tying the game late in regulation with 28 secs left to go into OT. No score in 1st OT, 2nd OT, Leo Smith hits for 2 putting Anchors up by 2 with 11 secs left (meanwhile the roof is exploding), but a desperation toss by ICS banked in, next 3rd OT no scoring forcing "sudden death" (1st team to score wins) and ICS scores, Anchors lose a tough fought game. Scoring: Will Szczepaniak (4), Leo Smith (2), Grant Urbanski (2), Christos Christopoulos (2). The 4th grade girls lost a tough one to St. Ursula 10 - 2, as the opponent's full-court press was a bit much for our Anchors. Next week, our girls will do the pressing. Scoring by Amelie Theodore (2) who has scored in the last 3 games. 6th grade girls faced a tough ICS team for the second time this season and while holding them to less points, couldn't seem to get the ball to drop. A strong defensive performance in the 2nd half wasn't enough to reign in the opponent's scoring. Paige Purtell scored a basket preventing the shutout in a 22 - 2 loss. 7th grade girls lost a close one to OLPH, 9 -7, we fought hard for 28 minutes only to fall victim to a missed call in the last seconds of the game with the ball in our hands. Scoring: Micayla Williams (5) including a 3-pointer and Emilia Smith added a bucket.
