Basketball: Greetings! My name is Chuck Dorsey, my grandchildren attend SCS, Emma - 6th grade and Timmy - 4th grade. Many of you know that SCS has competed in the Archdiocese of Baltimore CYO Basketball

program the past two years. www.archbalt.org/archdiocesan-youth-sports/ Our program was very successful last year winning more games than our first year. SCS will be able to have as many teams as we want in the program, as long as each team has enough players (9+) and parents, family members, teachers, or other volunteers, to coach, (at least 2 but preferably 3). The season starts the first week in December and runs to the end of February, finishing up with post-season play. We will be using our gym for practice (one practice per week beginning in October). Thank You Fr. Dennis and Ms. Bernie!!! Teams would travel to a parish (same parish each week) in the Baltimore Metro to play games (Saturday or Sunday depending on the league). The games are officiated using mostly state certified high school officials and play according to NFHS rules. The age groups start at 4th grade (teams are formed by grade and not by age) and up thru 8th grade. It is possible for someone to "play up" at the next level or play on two teams.
